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Dear Members:

The Board wanted to let you know that we, along with Jeff and his crew, are closely watching for the arrival of summer and with it, mosquitoes. Most of you are aware that the Zika virus is the latest pandemic to threaten the southern US and, unfortunately, we are included in the areas that may be effected. While there have been no locally acquired cases reported in the US, there have been 195 travel related cases reported and we are very mindful of the threat. Jeff has already purchased the chemicals for the foggers, so we are about as ready as we can be. Please watch the newsletter for Jeff's suggestions for chemicals and other control ideas to help reduce local mosquito populations. By the time you get this, the Village and LSIOT will have executed a new contract for police coverage of the roads and lake. The new contract should provide adequate resources for the patrols, particularly during the summer, and simultaneously promote better communication between the Village and our POA. The process took longer than we had envisioned, but the Village and LSIOT have a good understanding in place, with shared goals and visions. Hopefully, this will promote a safer community for us all.







### FICTION

**COMETH THE HOUR**, by Jeffery Archer. A suicide note had devastating consequences for Harry and Emma Clifton, Giles Barrington, and Lady Virginia. Virginia faces bankruptcy; Giles contemplates leaving politics to rescue the woman he loves from behind the Iron Curtain; and Harry tries to get a Soviet writer released from a Siberian gulag. Sixth in the Clifton Chronicles.

**OFF THE GRID**, by C.J. Box. Nate Romanowski is off the grid, recuperating from wounds and trying to deal with past crimes, when he is suddenly surrounded by a small team of elite professional special operators. They're not there to threaten him, but to make a deal. They need help destroying a domestic terror cell in Wyoming's Red Desert, and in return they'll make Nate's criminal record disappear. But they are not what they seem, as Nate's friend Joe Pickett discovers. They have a much different plan in mind, and it just may be something that takes them all down—including Nate and Joe.

**HIDDEN BODIES**, by Caroline Kepnes. Joe Goldberg can't stop looking over his shoulder. The problem with hidden bodies is that they don't always stay that way. They re-emerge, like dark thoughts, multiplying and threatening to destroy what Joe wants most: true love. And when he finds it in a darkened room in Soho House, he's more desperate than ever to keep his secrets buried. He doesn't want to hurt his new girlfriend he wants to be with her forever. But if she ever finds out what he's done, he may not have a choice..."

**FLIGHT OF DREAMS**, by Ariel Lawhon. In May, 1937, Emilie Imhof boards the airship Hindenburg as its only female crew member. Everyone on board, from the dynamic vaudeville acrobat to the high-standing German officer, harbors dark secrets. And at least one person is determined to make sure the airship doesn't make the return trip.

**A GIRL'S GUIDE TO MOVING ON**, by Debbie Macomber. A mother and her daughter-in-law bravely leave their troubled marriages and face the challenge of starting over. Leaning on each other, Nichole and Leanne discover that their inner strength and capacity for love are greater than they ever imagined.

**THE FORGOTTEN SOLDIER**, by Brad Taylor. A Special Forces soldier is killed on an operation in Afghanistan, and complicit in the attack is a government official of an allied nation. While the US administration wants to forget the casualty, one Taskforce member will not. When he sets out to avenge his brother's death, his actions threaten to not only expose the Taskforce's activities but also destroy a web of alliances against a greater evil. Pike Logan understands the desire but also the danger. Brought in to eliminate the risk, he's now forced to choose between his friend and the administration he's sworn to protect, while unbeknownst to either of them, the soldier's death is only the beginning. . . .

## **NON FICTION**

**THE BOYS IN THE BOAT**, by Daniel James Brown. The true story of the University of Washington's 1936 eight-oar crew and their epic quest for an Olympic gold medal. These sons of loggers, shipyard workers, and farmers defeated elite rivals from eastern and British universities before challenging the German crew rowing for Adolf Hitler in the 1936 Berlin Olympic games. Along the way they transformed the sport of rowing and grabbed the attention of millions of Americans.

**WHEN BREATH BECOMES AIR**, by Paul Kalanithi. A young physician faced with a terminal cancer diagnosis attempts to answer the question: What makes a life worth living? He chronicles his transformation from naive medical student into a Stanford neurosurgeon, and finally into a patient and new father confronting his own mortality.

## **AUDIO**

**A WALK FOR SUNSHINE**, by Jeff Alt. Jeff Alt takes you along every step of his 2,160-mile Appalachian Trail adventure filled with humorous, frightening, and inspirational stories including, bears, bugs, blisters, skunk bedmates, and hilarious food cravings. As Alt walked on through freezing temperatures, driving rain, and sunny skies, he was constantly buoyed by the knowledge that his walk was dedicated to his brother who has cerebral palsy. Alt's adventure inspired an annual fundraiser which has raised over \$150,000 for the Sunshine Home where his brother lives.

**FOOL ME ONCE**, by Harlan Coben. Former special-ops pilot Maya, home from the war, sees an unthinkable image captured by her nanny cam while she is at work. Her two-year-old daughter is playing with Maya's husband, Joe – who had been brutally murdered two weeks earlier. Maya must come to terms with deep secrets and deceit in her own past before she can face the truth about her husband – and herself.

**THE ABDUCTION**, by Mark Gimenez. Suddenly the little girl is missing. Someone posing as her uncle has taken her – but she has no uncle. Her father and her grandfather are the only ones looking for her. As they race against time, family secrets from their past make her survival more uncertain with every passing minute.

To obtain a BUILDING PERMIT, you must submit a BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION. Building Permit Applications are available at the Village Hall, Lake Tanglewood Corporation Office, or online at [www.laketanglewood.org](http://www.laketanglewood.org)

BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATIONS must be submitted one week before the next Building Committee Meeting. Meetings are held on Wednesday, 5:30pm at Village Hall.

## Village Notes

The village Board of Aldermen have been busy the first quarter of 2016. I will briefly discuss a few of the key issues with which the board has taken action.

1. The **Building Code** portion of our ordinances has had a few changes. These include adopting the most current version of the International Residential Code (IRC), which forms the basis of our building code. This is what the local builders and inspectors use for new construction and remodels.

2. Changes to our building codes have been made to bring us in line with the requirements of other local building codes and the IRC regarding roof repairs and replacement. Additionally, a **Building Permit and inspection is now required for roof repairs and replacement**. The village secretary or building committee chairman can provide specific information and answer questions if you are planning on doing any roof work.

3. **Prominent and visible house numbers** are important for first responders in locating the address to which they are responding. Our ordinances now require all residences to have street numbers clearly visible from the street fronting the property. Each character or number must be a minimum of 4 inches or larger and numbers must not be spelled out.

With our waterfront property we have a unique situation where our police are called to respond when on lake patrol. As a result of the challenge of identifying street addresses from the lake, our ordinances now require **waterfront property to have house numbers including street name** (i.e. 777 Dolphin Terr) clearly visible from the lake. The location of the address signs may vary because of unique property differences, but may be on the boat dock, sea wall or back yard. Contact the building committee chairman or village secretary for specific information.

4. Over the years, our village has experienced at least two tragic wildfires. The most recent was in February 2011. There has also been evidence over the years (most recently this year) of campfires in remote areas of our village. Areas with high fire fuel loads and limited accessibility for firefighters. This is extremely dangerous, especially when considering our year round threat of wildfires. Because of this wildfire threat, the aldermen passed ordinance no. 5.01.002 which states, **With the exception of specially constructed patio fire pits and fireplaces,**

**it shall be unlawful to have an out door open fire or campfire anyplace within the limits of the Village of Lake Tanglewood.** Approved brush burning in accordance with Sec. 5.01.001 is still permitted.

The board of aldermen also approved a resolution **prohibiting the open carry of handguns at Village of Lake Tanglewood meetings** governed by the Texas Open Meetings Act. This resolution only applies to Village Board of Aldermen meetings, Building and Zoning Committee meetings and special called meetings of the village governing body. It is important that our meetings encourage free and open discussion on all subjects pertinent to the residents of our village. The board and mayor unanimously felt the open carry of handguns could, in some instances be a deterrent to free and open discussion.

**Police Contract Update.** The new contract between L.S.I.O.T. and the village has been signed. It is a two year renewable contract which is good through September 30, 2018.

**Mark your calendars for July 3<sup>rd</sup> and July 4<sup>th</sup>.** Our annual fireworks will be at dark on Sunday July 3<sup>rd</sup>. The parade and picnic will be Monday July 4<sup>th</sup>.

## **Village of Lake Tanglewood Roofing Requirements (2016)**

Permits are required for all roofing projects over 100 sq. ft. Residential roofing permits are \$50.00 with one inspection (min.) at \$125.00. (Note: new construction roofing will be included in the new home construction permit. A separate permit is not required).

Roof coverings of asphalt shingle, wood, slate, clay, cement, or asbestos cement tile shall not be installed without first removing all existing layers of roof coverings. An additional layer of those materials on top of an existing layer is not permitted: (see exceptions for complete and separate metal roofing systems in the 2015 International Residential Code)

Wood shakes and shingles shall only be used on solid sheathing.

### **Required Information on Building Permit Application for Roofing:**

- Section I All homeowner's information.
- Section II All contractor's contact and insurance (bonding and liability) information.
- Section III State type of building (main dwelling, detached garage, shed, etc.) and type of roof material (asphalt shingle, wood, etc.). If this is the main dwelling, please indicate if there is an attached garage or any fuel-fired appliances.

### **Carbon Monoxide Alarms**

Carbon Monoxide Alarms are required in dwellings that have attached garages or fuel-fired appliances. A minimum of one (1) CO alarm is required at each sleeping area, outside the bedroom(s). Example: a hallway common to one or more bedroom doorways is considered a sleeping area. It is possible to have a combination smoke and carbon monoxide alarm.

Approved alarms shall be installed in accordance with manufacturer's installation instructions or located on the wall at a height 42 to 90 inches above floor, avoiding locations near heating/cooling vents or areas which provide turbulent airflow, and minimum 36 inches away from openings to areas of high humidity. Avoid installing CO alarms in kitchens or above fuel-burning appliances.

***In order to pass the roofing inspection, required CO alarm(s) must be installed.***

The Building Committee recommends obtaining the services of a roofing contractor who is licensed with the City of Amarillo or with the City of Canyon. These contractors carry a \$20,000 bond and \$300,000 residential liability insurance.
