





MY GRANDMOTHER ASKED ME TO TELL YOU SHE'S SORRY, by **Fredrik Backman**. Elsa is seven years old and different. Her grandmother is seventy-seven years old and crazy, standing-on-the-balcony-firing-paintball-guns-at-men-who-want-to-talk-about-Jesus-crazy. She is also Elsa's best, and only, friend. When Elsa's grandmother dies and leaves behind a series of letters apologizing to people she has wronged, Elsa's greatest adventure begins.

IMMORTAL NICHOLAS, by Glenn Beck. Beck fashions a new image of St. Nicholas, as a warrior who originally protects Jesus.

COMMANDER IN CHIEF, by Tom Clancy. A floating natural gas facility in Lithuania blows up. A Venezuelan prosecutor is assassinated. An attack on a Russian troop train kills dozens. U.S. President Jack Ryan sees a guiding hand – that of the powerful Russian dictator – in the worldwide chaos, but before he can act, he needs proof.

CROSS JUSTICE, by James Patterson. When his cousin is accused of a heinous crime, Alex Cross returns to his North Carolina hometown for the first time in over three decades. As he tries to prove his cousin's innocence in a town where everyone seems to be on the take, Cross unearths a family secret that forces him to question everything he's ever known.

PRECIOUS GIFTS, by Danielle Steel. Paul Parker had shrugged off the demands of marriage and parenting to pursue life as an international bon vivant. But after his death, his very personal bequests to each of his children are designed to help them achieve their own unique dreams. He saved his biggest surprise for his ex-wife, Veronique: a gift that finally sets her free.

NON FICTION

AGENTS OF THE APOCALYPSE, by Dr. David Jeremiah. Are we living in the end times? Is it possible that the plLlayers depicted in the book of Revelation could be out in force today? And if they are, would you know how to recognize them?

THOMAS JEFFERSON AND THE TRIPOLI PIRATES, by Brian Kilmead.
